Session Title: Reconstructing the regional trading order in the Asia-Pacific:  
Lessons and Implications from the NAFTA renegotiation and the TPP 11

The US withdrew the TPP (Trans-Pacific Partnership) soon after Mr. Trump assumed the US presidency. Since then, countries in the Asia-Pacific region have been trying to reconstruct the regional trading order by, among others, reviving the TPP with the 11 remaining countries, and by renegotiating the NAFTA (North American Free Trade Agreement) with the US. Now that the TPP 11 was signed and the NAFTA renegotiation is approaching its conclusion, what lessons can we draw from these for the future of the regional trading order in the Asia-Pacific? Will Japan, Mexico and Chile be able to take the initiative in the reconstruction of regional trading order in the Asia-Pacific? How should these countries deal with the US and China, the two big powers in the region, in trade diplomacy? This panel will discuss these and other issues for the future of the regional trading order in the Asia-Pacific.
